1. Abbreviations used: b: = born, Bapt: = Baptized, ca. = circa, CoE = Church of England, d: = died, m: = married, Q1 = January to March, Q2 = April to June, Q3 = July to September, Q4 = October to December, Wit: = Witnesses, (X) = Did not sign register but "made their mark", St.M&AA,H. = St.Michael & All Angels, Hughenden, Bucks, UK
2. Until 1752, the church recorded dates using a year which ended on the 25th March. Thus the year given for the months of January, February and most of March are one year earlier than they would be written today. For these three months, the entries above are shown in the order, church date/modern date, for example, 17 Mar.1727/8.
3. Thomas Free (senior) made a will 18 May 1717 (Ref: Bucks CRO Aylesbury D/A/We 55/184) naming Mary, John, William and Thomas (junior) and grandchildren William, John and Elizabeth Free (see 21211111.ftd), also his daughter Ellinor Floyd and grandsons Joseph and John Floyd as beneficiaries. Thomas is named as executor and is thus assumed to be his eldest son. Probate granted July 1717.
4. Mary Free "single woman of Culverton" made a will on 10 Jul.1741 naming nephew John Free as executor (refer to 21211111.ftd). He and nephew William Free are beneficiaries along with Mary's brother William and her "two sisters Elizabeth Free and Elleanor Floyd". Proved 2 May 1743. (Ref: Bucks CRO Aylesbury D/A/We 78). See also note 8.
5. Thomas Free (junior) made a will 30 Apr.1730 naming his brother William. (Ref: Bucks CRO Aylesbury D/A/We 151 Adm).
6. John Free made a will 15 Oct.1730 naming his John Free the son of his brother William as his executor and a beneficiary, William's son William, his sister Mary and the grandsons of his uncle William, William, John and Jonathan were beneficiaries. A memorandum appended to this will says his brother Thomas is deceased. (Ref: Bucks CRO Aylesbury D/A/We 67/154).
7. William and Elizabeth Free are beneficiaries in the will of Katherine Stone, widow of Princes Risborough of 16 Apr.1726. (Ref: Bucks CRO Aylesbury D/A/We 62/48).
8. The only evidence for Elizabeth (nee) Free is Mary Free's 1741 will where she refers to her "two sisters Elizabeth Free and Elleanor Floyd" but possibly she is referring to her sister-in-law, the wife of her brother William.
9. Eleanor's husband Joseph Floyd was b:ca.1690, d:ca.1757 and was interred at Princes Risborough. He was a brickmaker and had a kiln in Kiln Lane, Lacey Green, the hamlet where they lived.
